Fire Season starts Saturday 1st November 2025

The Hallett CFS has undertaken its pre-season trainings as well as holding an awards ceremony for our members. They are listed below

Brad Tiver – 30 Year Service Clasp

Brad joined the CFS on 20 January 1993 with the Marcollat Brigade in the South East of South Australia, before transferring to the Hallett Brigade in 2015. Over the years, Brad has demonstrated exceptional dedication and initiative. He is often among the first on scene at local fires in his farm fire unit, providing a rapid and effective initial response that has proven invaluable to both the brigade and the wider community.

Lachlan Riggs – 10 Year Service Medal

Lachlan has reached a significant milestone with 10 years of service to the CFS. He regularly assists in local firefighting efforts, often responding in his farm fire unit to provide early and

effective support. Lachlan's consistent reliability and enthusiasm for helping others embody the CFS spirit.

Kym Riggs – 50 Year Service Medal

Kym joined the Hallett CFS on 4 December 1973, marking an incredible 50 years of continuous service. During this time, Kym has held numerous ranks, including Senior Firefighter for 10 years 5th lieutenant for 4 years, 3rd lieutenant for 2 years and 2nd lieutenant for 4 years. Alongside his son Lachlan, he frequently assists with local fires in his own farm fire unit, contributing to rapid early responses. Kym's half-century of service reflects remarkable dedication, leadership, and loyalty.

Malcolm Kelly – 40 Year Service Clasp

Malcolm joined the Hallett CFS on 11 November 1980 and has now served faithfully for 40 years. A regular participant in AGMs, burn-over drills, and incident responses, Malcolm is also a familiar face at local fires with his farm fire unit, where his quick actions have often prevented small outbreaks from becoming major events. Around 12 years ago, Malcolm was injured while fighting a fast-moving grass fire. Despite his injuries, he continued working alongside his son James to stop the fire from jumping a road and entering difficult terrain — a true display of courage and commitment.

Karin Dykstra – 5 Year Service Award

Karin has been a dedicated member of the brigade for five years, providing essential operations support. From running the radio

room to maintaining the brigade facilities and grounds, Karin's efforts have ensured the smooth running of daily operations. Her reliability, pride, and attention to detail have made her an indispensable part of the team.

Patricia Nolan – 10 Year Service Medal

Patricia has served the CFS for 10 years, playing a vital role in operations support. From running the radio room to coordinating the weekly siren and pager test, Patricia's dedication has been unwavering — her Tuesday midday siren could always be counted on, 'like clockwork.' Although she has stepped back in recent years, her reliability, professionalism, and long-term commitment have been invaluable. We sincerely thank Patricia for her years of service and for being such a dependable cornerstone of the brigade's operations.

Steve Tabone – 5 Year Service Award

Steve joined the Hallett CFS Brigade on 24 February 2018 and, in that time, has proven to be an invaluable and highly committed member of the team. He has served as the Brigade Equipment Coordinator and 1st Lieutenant for the past six years, demonstrating exceptional leadership, reliability, and dedication to the brigade's operations. Steve's service extends beyond the local area — he was among those who deployed to Kangaroo Island during the catastrophic

2019–2020 fires. His contribution during that critical time reflects his courage and commitment to supporting communities in need. Despite living in Jamestown, Steve continues to be one of the first to arrive at the station, often rolling out the door in one of the Hallett trucks — and on more than one occasion, overtaking several Jamestown appliances on the way. His enthusiasm, sense of duty, and reliability have earned him the respect and appreciation of his fellow members.

Chris McGloin – National Emergency Medal

Chris joined the Hallett CFS on 9 September 2014 and has since held ranks including Senior Firefighter, 2nd Lieutenant, and 1st Lieutenant. He has attended over 57 incidents locally and completed four interstate deployments, assisting in major fires across Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland, Kangaroo Island, Yorketown and Edithburgh. The National Emergency Medal is awarded in recognition of exceptional commitment and service during significant national emergencies. This medal honours Chris's dedication not only to the Hallett community but to South Australia and the nation as a whole.

Oliver Ball – 10 Year Service Medal

Oliver began his CFS journey with the Blackwood Brigade on 17 April 2009, later transferring to Hallett on 5 March 2018. At the same time, he also joined the Hallett SES, contributing to numerous life-saving road crash rescues and emergency incidents.

Since joining Hallett, Oliver has advanced rapidly — from Firefighter to Brigade Captain in 2021, and in 2023, promoted to Deputy Group Officer 2 for the Hallett Group, as well as looking after Group Communications and Fire Prevention Officer liaising with the Goyder Council. Over his CFS and SES service, Oliver has attended an impressive 338 incidents — a testament to his exceptional dedication, leadership, and professionalism.

Pam Herraman – 20 Year Service Clasp & CFS Life Membership

Pam joined the Hallett Brigade on the 19-6-2003, In those 22 years Pam has held the rank of 3rd lieutenant for 6 years and 4th lieutenant for 3 years as well as running the radio room and being the brigade administration coordinator. Although stepping back in recent years Pam has attended many fires and incidents, being a reliable and hard-working crewmember in tough conditions. As well as being the Hallett SES unit manager Pam has committed countless hours to the brigade being the face behind the scenes that keeps everything running, Pam's unwavering support and commitment to both the CFS and SES is something very special and without it, both agencies would struggle to operate in Hallett.

David McDonald – CFS Life Membership

David joined the Hallett Brigade on 11 December 1987, marking nearly 38 years of service. Throughout his tenure, he has held many leadership positions, including Senior Firefighter, 4th Lieutenant, 2nd Lieutenant, and 1st Lieutenant, and was also a

founding member of the Hallett SES. David's dedication to helping others, whether in yellow or orange, and often both has been an inspiration to many. I've seen firsthand the countless things you've done quietly and selflessly for others, even when no one was watching, you were there helping, that's a rare and special trait. Thank you for your years of service to the community, and continuing to be a pillar of the community who can be relied on to help those in need.

In Memory of Ashley Phin

We were saddened to hear of the recent passing of Ashley Phin at 88 years. Ashley grew up in Hallett, where his parents owned and ran Phin's Stores from 1922 to 1965. The business included a main shop, two bulk stores, a garage and a corner store along Jessie Street, with the family home attached to the main shop. Phin's Stores was established by William (Bill Snr) in the interwar period before his eldest son, Bill (Bill Jnr), took over the running of the business in the early 1950s. In a time gone by, the Phin's were able to attain and supply a wide range of goods and services that supplied the wider mid north pastoral district. In 1959, the business had some 314 accounts, which demonstrates the one-time strength of the Hallett district. Ashley attended Hallett Primary and Burra High Schools before the family sold the business and moved to Adelaide in 1964. Ashley always saw himself as a son of Hallett, even though he spent the latter part of his life in the Glenelg district. He continued to visit Hallett regularly over the years as he researched the Phin family history (that included the Williams, Bald & Tiver families). Ashley maintained a fond connection with the town and people of Hallett. Ashley was laid to rest in the Hallett Cemetery.



Never handle a snake, their bites can have severe consequences if left untreated.

Just be aware that they are in and around Hallett and have already been swooping locals and visitors alike. Good luck, stay safe out there!



WHAT TO PLANT IN NOVEMBER

What an introduction to Spring! Hot temperatures in the 30's, rain and wind. Our gardens won't know what to do with the changes in temperature and climate. Hopefully your gardens are surviving and aren't being pummeled too badly with the strong winds. Here's hoping some blossoms manage to stay on the plants.

Here is what to plant in your gardens during November:

Vegetables:

Basil, Beans, Beetroot, Brussel Srouts, Cabbage, Carrott, Chervil, Chives, Corn, Kale, Leek, Lettuce, Potato, Radish, Rhubarb, Rosella, Silverbeet, Spring Onion, Swede and Turnip.

Flowers:

Alyssum, Bergamot, Billy Buttons, Borage, Calendula, Cerinthe, Cleome, Corn Cockle, Cornflower, Cosmos, Delphinium, Echinacea, Everlasting Daisy, False Queen Anne's Lace, Hollyhock, Lupin, Marigold, Mignonette, Nasturtium, Nemophila, Poppy, Salvia Seeds, Sturt's Desert Pea, Sunflower, Viola and Zinnia. Happy Planting!

Along with our plants springing back to life, the local trees have been issuing forth with their pollens. Not a great time for Hay Fever sufferers unfortunately. Hopefully the rain will help to keep the pollen out of the air. It is a great time to get out in our gardens and plant, plant, plant. Here's to plentiful Summer crops!

Fire Danger Season is just around the corner - Start Preparing Now!



⚠ Winter is a great time to start preparing your property for the Fire Danger Season. A little bit of work now goes a long way to have your property prepared heading into spring and summer.

⚠ Some simple tasks now will keep that spring growth in check and help make your property more manageable as it heats up.

BClean up the autumn leaves on your property, being sure to remember the gutters.

₿Pick up all the sticks and branches downed by wind and winter weather.

B'Spray the areas you can't mow or whipper snip, along fence lines, next to structures and among garden ornaments.

#Mow and keep mowing the property to keep grasses and weeds below 10cm.

#Trim desirable vegetation and completely remove undesirable plants and bushes while the soil is soft. Plan and replant your garden with bushfire preparedness in mind.

Make use of your new FOGO bins for the green waste, compost at home or utilise our waste transfer stations. Be sure to keep an eye out for our free green waste days around October.

Be sure to prepare your assets by carrying out maintenance and repairs or at least start planning them for spring. This can be as simple as fixing up shed flashings or addressing gaps in roofing, under eves and around windows and doors.

Guidelines to applicants for the No Spray Register.

Council is responsible for vegetation management within its road reserves. Management methods for the control of vegetation include slashing and the use of chemical herbicides to kill vegetation growing in the road reserve.

Stormwater gutters will be maintained in a manner that presents the gutter in a manner where it is completely void of all growth and obstructions.

Council acknowledges that there will be residents within the Goyder region that do not wish to have the frontage of their property up to the storm water gutter sprayed with chemical herbicides for a variety of reasons. The 'No Spray register' allows property owners and residents to apply to Council to request that vegetation on Council road reservations and/or Council land abutting their property not be sprayed.

1 APPLICATIONS FOR THE NO SPRAY REGISTER

An application requesting to be added to the Regional Council of Goyder's 'No Spray register' must be submitted on the approved application form and lodged with Council. An application can only be applicable to the frontage of the resident or land owners immediate property perimeter fence neighbouring Council land.

In considering an application, officers will take into consideration:

- whether the adjoining land is used for certified organic vegetable/fruit production;
- existence of a medical condition in the household which may be exacerbated by exposure to herbicides or associated additives;
- other mitigating circumstances that would warrant an area not being exposed to the use of herbicide chemicals.

Council reserves the right to reject any application on grounds that it is not within the overall interest of Council to include the area within the 'No Weed Spray register'.

If an application is refused, Council will provide a response outlining the reasons for refusal. Applicants may reapply if they feel they can adequately address the concerns that caused Council to refuse their application.

2 NON-CONFORMANCE

Where an application is approved, the resident or land owner assumes the responsibility for the management of weeds on the road reserve, footpath in front of, and or the perimeters of the property neighbouring Council land.

Failure to do so will result in the removal of the resident/ land owner from the 'No Weed Spray register' and Council undertaking, without furthernotice, any necessary spraying and/or slashing to reduce the vegetation.

3 MARKING OF NO SPRAY AREAS

No spray areas shall be marked with a NO WEED SPRAY sign at the resident/ land owners cost.

Resident/ land owners must ensure that the signs are maintained and clearly visible.

Council will include within all tenders and contracts for roadside spraying the advice that No Weed Spray Zones have been established and provide a list and map of No Weed Spray Zones to appointed contractors.

Areas not under the care and control of Council will be subjected to the landowner to comply with all regulations relating to the Fire & Emergency Services Act 2005 and any resulting orders issued under the Act

By completing the application, the applicant signifies their agreement to undertake vegetation management in accordance with the above guidelines of Council's No Weed Spray register.


